


Moscow – St. Petersburg

Through a dizzying array of canals and locks built by the Soviets, the Volga is now the linchpin of a single water system linking Moscow and St. Petersburg to five separate seas. In partially visible towns flooded by the Soviets, cathedrals rise from water. Medieval Orthodox monasteries are still in use on the riverbanks. Revealing the «real Russia», a cruise down the Volga River offers a rare glimpse into Russia's colorful past and enterprising future.



Moscow – Astrakhan

The Volga basin witnessed signal events in the formation of the Russian state: the emergence of the Golden Horde, Ivan the Terrible's overthrow of the khans, turning battles of the World War II. As rare as a trip along the Upper Volga may be, the Lower Volga, running south and away from the population centers of Moscow and St. Petersburg, is still an area of outstanding beauty largely unexplored by tourists.

After lunch in Podvorie, a restaurant in a traditional Russian log house, on the way back to St. Petersburg visit a 'Russia in Miniature' Interactive Museum. Done with a great care and attention to detail, this very realistic model of Russia will give you a great picture of this vast country full of stereotypes, generalizations and main attractions of every region.

Enjoy a costumed reception at the Governor's House, and then reboard the *Volga Dream* in time for lunch.



Day 6. NIZHNIY NOVGOROD

Nizhniy Novgorod (formerly Gorkiy), once a wealthy commercial center poised on the trade routes to the East, became a closed city due to military activity during the Soviet era. After lunch in a local restaurant proceed to the Old Tretyakov gallery to view its extraordinary collection of Russian art, ranging from 12th-century icons to 20th-century paintings. Explore Moscow's Metro, known for its architectural splendour.
