
KILT HIRE





The applicable deposit (15% unless otherwise stated) must be paid to us when you book (or if booking within 56 days of departure, full payment must be made on booking).

If there are fewer than 12 passengers in your party, and if you have made your booking more than 56 days before departure and have paid a deposit to secure your booking, the balance of the cost of your arrangements (including any applicable surcharge) is due not less than 56 days prior to scheduled departure.

If there are 12 or more passengers in your party, payments must be made as follows: 15% of the cost of your arrangements is payable on booking, a further 35% of such cost (including any applicable surcharge) is due 90 days before departure (if your booking is made between 90 and 56 days before departure you will be required to pay 50% of the cost of your arrangements on booking and the balance is due 56 days before departure). If your booking is made less than 56 days before departure, out will be required to pay the entire cost of your arrangements at the time of your booking. If we do not receive (in cleared funds) the relevant sum due in full and on time, we reserve the right to treat your booking as cancelled by you, in which case cancellation charges will become payable.

Cancellation charges apply in the event that you or any member of your party cancels a confirmed booking. These charges will increase the closer to your departure date that you notify us of a cancellation.

Non-UK passport holders, including other EU nationals, should obtain up-to-date advice on passport and visa requirements from the Embassy, High Commission or Consulate of your destination or country(ies) through which they are travelling.
