

Canal cruising is much simpler than you think. No need to be an experienced sailor—everything is designed to set you off with peace of mind.




No license required, accessible to all

Most popular options:

Bike rental: the best way to explore the surroundings. Available at all our bases (adult and children's sizes, baby seats available on request).

Barbecue: enjoy a convivial meal by the water, at lunchtime or in the evening. Available at most bases.

Wi-Fi device rental: to help you save your mobile data.

Final cleaning package: extend the holiday feeling for a few more hours after your departure.

Pet package: your pets are welcome on board, and we ensure thorough cleaning at the end of your stay.

Navigational guide: compulsory on board, this detailed map shows currents, navigation zones, mooring points and nearby services (grocery shops, laundries, etc.). If ordered in advance, it can be sent to you by post.

Grocery delivery on board: place your order in advance and we'll stock your boat with your shopping before you arrive.



Paddleboard rental: available only in Germany, Italy, the Netherlands and Camargue.

12/220 V converter rental: required to charge laptops and other 220 V devices from the boat's battery.

Early check-in / Late return: available on last-minute request and subject to boat availability.

Parking: at certain departure bases, you can reserve a secure, and in some cases covered, parking space for your vehicle.

Dinghy rental: available only in Ireland and Italy (dinghies from 3.5 to 4.5 m).

Taxi transfers: we can organise transfers from train stations and airports, or back to your departure base if you are on a one-way cruise.

Car transfer: your vehicle can be delivered to your arrival base in the case of a one-way cruise.

Partial Deposit Waiver: this option allows you to reduce the amount of the security deposit required in case of damage (details: see the General Terms and Conditions).

Sustainable cruising

Each year, Riverly strengthens its commitment to a more sustainable form of river tourism—one that respects both local communities and the natural environment.

Lowering emissions



Since 2025, 100% of Riverly's owned fleet (formerly Locaboat and Nicols) has been running on HVO fuel, a hydrotreated vegetable oil that is renewable and biodegradable. This has helped us cut our CO2 emissions by 92%.

Hybrid propulsion By 2026, 39 of our boats use hybrid engines, and since 2018, we also offer two electric boats in Alsace.

Blue Flag commitment

In 2026, four Riverly bases have earned the Blue Flag certification, a mark of excellence in sustainable tourism..

Protecting the Canal du Midi

Like Locaboat and Nicols before us, Riverly supports replanting efforts along the Canal du Midi. So far, over 19,000 trees have been replanted.

Everyday eco-actions

All boats are cleaned with eco-friendly products and equipped with onboard recycling bins. Selective waste collection is available at every base.

Awarded annually, the "Blue Flag" distinguishes beaches and marinas for their high environmental and social standards. In 2024, only 31 river marinas in France were certified, including four Riverly bases: Corbigny, Saintes, Saint-Martin sur Oust and Joigny.

From Bram

Our Bram base lies near Castelnaudary, a town rich with culinary delights and historic charm. Set off and you'll soon reach beautiful Carcassonne, home to Europe's largest medieval fortress.

From Négra

Cruise west to reach Toulouse. Take time to explore the vibrant streets of the "Pink City" before continuing to the fortified village of Montech in the heart of Quercy.



From Argens or Le Somail

Make a stop in the medieval villages of Trèbes and Puichéric, then cruise under the arched bridge of Le Somail, renowned for its basket-handle shape, before reaching this charming village, ranked among the Canal du Midi's most beautiful sites. Further on, take the Canal de la Robine toward Narbonne, once a Roman city.

If you choose to continue your cruise toward the Thau Lagoon, you'll reach the spectacular Fonsérannes Locks, just a short distance from Béziers—birthplace of Pierre-Paul Riquet, the canal's visionary creator.

From Lattes

South of Montpellier, Lattes is your gateway to the Canal du Rhône à Sète. Welcome to the Petite Camargue, where nature puts on a spectacular show each day. Along the way, discover Aigues- Mortes, the fortified city of Saint LYess. Further west, make a stop at Mas des Baumelles and continue on to the capital of the Camargue: Les Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer, with their whitewashed houses. Then cruise up the Petit Rhône and pause in Beaucaire, a town of art and history in the Gard region.



From Bellegarde

Heading toward Sète, let the channel guide you across the Étang de Thau—a vast inland sea surrounded by rolling hills and quaint harbours. The clear, salty waters are perfect for swimming: drop anchor or pull up near a small beach for a refreshing break in a stunning natural setting. Bouzigues is a must-stop for oyster and shellfish lovers—the local delicacies are farmed right in the lagoon. Further on, stop in Agde, an ancient Greek town known as the “Black Pearl” for its striking volcanic stone buildings.

Did you know?

The pink hue of the salt marshes comes from a microscopic algae called *Dunaliella salina*, which naturally produces beta-carotene—an orange pigment that gives the water its variations color.

From Saintes

With its rich Gallo-Roman heritage, Saintes is the second largest city in the region. From here, cruise from village to village, admiring the red-tiled rooftops and beautiful Romanesque churches in places like Saint-Savinien, Chaniers, and Bourg-Charente.

Make a stop in Saint-Simon, where you can explore the history and heritage of the gabarriers—the traditional riverboatmen. Heading toward Angoulême, you'll arrive in Cognac, the capital of the famous “liqueur of the gods.” Visit its renowned trading houses, elegant mansions, and the historic Récollets convent.




From Sireuil

Set off from Sireuil, a charming departure point nestled in the heart of the vineyards, and drift along the gentle meanders of the Charente. Stop off at a nearby wine estate for an introductory tasting.

Soon, you'll reach Jarnac, where the grand cognac houses welcome curious visitors, and the flower-lined quays invite you to slow down and stroll.

Angoulême, perched high on its ramparts, is famous for its comic book festival and mural-covered walls. Its lively old town beats to the rhythm of its vibrant cultural life.




From Buzet sur Baïse

Set off along the Canal de Garonne toward Agen, the renowned capital of prunes, where 2,000 years of history have left a remarkable heritage. Heading in the direction of Toulouse, discover the 11th-century Abbey of Moissac, famous for its extraordinary Romanesque sculptures.

Along the way, treat yourself to local delights: Lot-et-Garonne tomatoes and strawberries, Armagnac, prunes, duck breast, regional wines...




If you follow the winding course of the Baïse River, you'll discover an entirely different landscape—greener, with wild, unspoiled banks. In Nérac, wander the old streets of the medieval town and pause on the Pont Vieux for a sweeping view of the Tanners' Quarter. In the former episcopal city of Condom, admire the cathedral, its cloister, the Armagnac museum, and the elegant mansions. From the riverbanks, a network of hiking trails invites you to explore the surrounding countryside.







The Agen aqueduct is the second longest in France. Built from Quercy limestone, it features 23 arches —each 20 metres wide and 10 metres high— spanning a total length of 549 metres.



Saint-Cirq-Lapopie, one of France's most beautiful villages

From Cahors

Begin your journey in Cahors, capital of the Lot region, where southern charm, rich heritage and gourmet delights come together. Labelled a “Town and Land of Art and History,” Cahors appeals equally to heritage lovers and fans of the French art de vivre. A little further on, Saint-Géry nestles at the foot of towering cliffs dotted with natural caves.

Then comes Saint-Cirq-Lapopie, a gem from the Middle Ages, perched on a rocky outcrop overlooking the Lot—a village best explored on foot.

Keep your eyes wide open: thanks to its strategic location, Saint-Cirq-Lapopie offers several breathtaking viewpoints.

Continue on to Larnagol, where the 18th-century château, nestled in the heart of the village, opens its doors to visitors. It boasts beautifully tiered gardens and preserved interiors that reflect the essence of French art de vivre.




From Joigny

Located at the crossroads of the Yonne and the Canal de Bourgogne (built in the 18th century), Joigny is the perfect departure point to explore this region rich in heritage and gastronomy. Follow the meanders of the Yonne: landscapes of hedgerow countryside and the Othe forest will guide you to Villeneuve-sur-Yonne, then Sens.

There, you'll discover the splendid Saint-Étienne Cathedral, considered France's first Gothic cathedral. Heading east, you'll reach Auxerre and its famous Chablis and Auxerrois vineyards. Begin your cruise on the Canal du Nivernais, where winemaking villages follow one after another among the vines and churches—like Saint-Bris-le-Vineux and Irancy.



Auxerre

Taking the Canal de Bourgogne, a land of water and forest, reveals some hidden gems. Saint-Florentin is one of them, and its church is a true treasure—featuring remarkable 16th-century sculptures and bas-reliefs, along with 24 stained-glass windows in rare harmony.

Next, stop in Tanlay, where the château stands as one of the finest examples of Renaissance architecture in Burgundy, renowned for its gallery decorated with trompe-l'oeil paintings and frescoes. A little further on, the remarkable Ancy-le-Franc palace welcomes visitors with its exceptional collection of mural paintings.



From Dompierre sur Besbre

Dompierre opens the doors to countless discoveries. You'll cruise along riverbanks lined with castles, abbeys, and charming villages. In Digoin, your boat will pass from the canal to the Canal du Centre, crossing a 19th-century canal bridge, then heading toward Paray-le-Monial. Let yourself be charmed by the sacred beauty of the basilica and the unique Romanesque architecture of southern Burgundy.

Moor at Diou or Beaulon and take a walk through the alleys of the Abbey of Charolles, a beautiful site nestled among the vineyards.

Once in Decize, nicknamed "the island city," your journey continues toward the town of La Machine. Each member of the crew will remember the delicious simplicity of a picnic on the grass.

To the north, the Canal Latéral à la Loire leads you to Sancerre, Apremont-sur-Allier and its flower-filled village, and finally Nevers.

Wines from Sancerre and PYeslly-Fumé go perfectly with a little goat cheese—say, Chavignol crottin.

From Corbigny

The Canal du Nivernais is one of the most beautiful river routes in France. In the town of Sardy-lès-Épiry, a spectacular series of 16 locks carries you up or down a 35 km stretch. The three tunnels at Collancelle follow one another and are unquestionably among the canal's most fascinating features.

For a nature-filled break, stop at Baye Lake, which borders the canal in an exceptional ecological setting. Back on the water: in the distance, you'll spot the silhouette of Châtillon-en-Bazois castle.



The Collancelle tunnels, dug through the Morvan hills, are a rare engineering feat. They span three consecutive tunnels, with a total length of 758 m, ranging from 268 m to 212 m.

From Plagny

From Plagny, your cruise begins in the peacefulness of the Loire countryside. The Canal Latéral à la Loire offers stunning open views of the surrounding hillsides and riverside heritage. Admire the medieval town of Nevers and its ducal palace, and don't miss Briare, with its spectacular canal bridge. At Chevenon, a 13th-century castle awaits in the heart of a peaceful hamlet.



In Mâcon, explore the historic centre with its Roman tile roofs and colourful facades, home to the town's key landmarks, including the former cathedral, Vieux Saint-Vincent.






From Scey-sur-Saône

Departing from Scey-sur-Saône, you'll pass through the Saint-Albin tunnel. Stretching 680 meters, its stone walls, soft lighting, and serene silence create a timeless, almost supernatural atmosphere.

Further along, Gray welcomes you with elegant townhouses, a museum housed in a former palace, and scenic riverbanks—perfect for fishing enthusiasts.

Continue your journey to Auxonne, a charming town with a rich military past. Napoleon Bonaparte once stayed here as a young lieutenant. Its arsenal, ramparts, and Gothic church are well worth a visit—just like the peaceful quays, ideal for strolling... or casting a fish line.



From Port-sur-Saône

Heading upstream, stop at Corre—the last sizeable village before the Canal des Vosges. Surrounded by meadows and forests, this peaceful spot is a paradise for fishing, wild swimming, or cycling along the greenway.

Further along, the ruined castle of Fontenoy-le-Château overlooks the valley, while the village centre invites you to take a gentle stroll. Continue on to Épinal—famed for its illustrated prints—where you'll find a lively town centre, landscaped riverbanks, and the iconic Musée de l'Imagerie.

Set course for Strasen, where scenic hiking trails lead you through lush green forests, past lakes and away from main roads.

A stop in Wesenberg invites you to wander through the Skulpturenpark, a park featuring an open-air sculpture exhibition.

A little further on, let yourself be charmed by the town of Neustrelitz and its Baroque castle.

To the south, stop in Himmelfort—famous not only as the hometown of Father Christmas, but also for its smoked fish and fishing traditions.

With a detour via Lychen, follow the Woblitz River through forests until you reach the large Lychen lake (Großer Lychensee), one of the most beautiful paddling routes in the region.

At the Regow lock, you might spot beavers and otters. Continue on to Templin to discover major historic sites such as its medieval town centre surrounded by partially preserved fortifications.

From Liebenwalde, take the historic Finow Canal and reach one of Europe's most unique engineering feats: the boat lift at Niederfinow.

If you hold a boating license, you can cruise all the way to the lakes of Neuruppin—true natural oases.

Then take the Oder-Havel Canal to reach Berlin and enjoy panoramic views from the Reichstag to Museum Island, before heading into the vibrant neighbourhoods of Kreuzberg and Prenzlauer Berg.



From Lübz

From Lübz, you can set sail towards the great lakes of Müritz and Plauer See to the east. These waters will enchant you with their charming towns, such as Plau and Waren. The Stör-Elde waterway will take you to Schwerin, the regional capital, where a fairy-tale castle sits proudly on an island.

We recommend a detour to Dömitz via the Müritz-Elde waterway — a haven for nature lovers and fishing enthusiasts. Let yourself be lulled by nature and bid goodnight to herons and beavers.
