A tale of two waterways

Canals, rivers, lakes... our customers explain why no two boating holidays are the same.

Canal du Midi, France

(Port Cassafières to Homps, 7 nights)

Canals are the perfect introduction to life on a boat. Still waters make them easy to navigate, and their banks are rarely too shallow to moor. You can tie up along the towpath almost wherever the whim takes you, giving you the freedom to go at your own pace.

Alison & Lisa, life long friends:

Days 1–3

"We arrive, get the basics from the base crew, and within minutes we're off. The calm is immediate - sunshine, calm waters, an instant switch-off. The famous Fonseranes staircase lock sounds like hard work but turns out to be great fun. We pull in for a picnic beside the canal and raid a nearby boulangerie. By day three the rhythm has us completely. Cruise, stop, wander, eat."

Days 4–6

"The boat feels like home now. Coffee on deck, nowhere to be. Le Somail is a highlight - small, pretty, slightly surreal. There's no navigation anxiety on a canal; you concentrate entirely on the world drifting past. More buzz in Narbonne - markets, tapas, a wander through the old town."

Days 7–8

"Second nature by now. Long, lazy stretches, vineyard views, the odd lock as gentle punctuation. The final day brings the best cruising of the week - unhurried, uncomplicated, exactly what a canal should be. A week of easy cruising, good food, and the slow pleasure of going nowhere fast."





Days 3–4

"This is where it really opens up - and where someone inevitably jumps in. That's the thing about rivers: the swimming. We stop near Cliveden, a walk up through the trees to the house above. Heron count: four. The countryside keeps shifting around every bend, always revealing something new to draw you on."

Days 5–6

"Windsor appears around a curve in the river, castle above the waterline - properly dramatic. More boats, more buzz. On the return stretch everything softens: a long afternoon swim off the back of the boat, someone trying their luck with a fishing line at Boulton's Lock. Rivers reward the relaxed and the curious in equal measure."

Days 7–8

"The final run back to Benson is joyful. We've learned to read the river a little - the current, the locks, the rhythm of it all. We've also swum in it, fished it, picnicked on its banks, and watched the scenery change around every corner."

River Thames, England

(Benson - Windsor - Benson, 7 nights)

Rivers are a different experience entirely. They twist and turn, the countryside shifts around every bend, and the scenery is often alive with wildlife. But the real draw - especially for families - is the water itself. You swim and fish in rivers.

Tom & Jamie, and family:

Days 1–2

"We pick up at Benson and head downstream into a morning mist that makes everything feel slightly unreal. A wide river, a gentle introduction, but already you can feel the difference from a canal - the variety, the movement, the sense that the landscape is constantly changing. Lunch at a riverside pub, and almost on cue, a crew of rowers streaks past. The locks are part of the adventure here, not an obstacle. Each one has its own character."





Cities *feel different* from the water.

Most of our waterways wind through stunning countryside - but plenty of them pass right through, or close to, some of Europe's greatest cities.

In places like Amsterdam and Bruges, you can moor up and step ashore right into the heart of the city.

Amsterdam, Netherlands

Lively, cosmopolitan, best explored by bike. Museums, markets, canal-side cafés and famous nightlife. Just a 4-hour cruise from our Amsterdam (Vinkeveen) base and 25 minutes by car.

London, England

Our Thames region brings you to the outskirts of the city, with the centre just 20–30 minutes by train. Buckingham Palace, the Tower of London, a West End show - easily done as a day out from your mooring.

Berlin, Germany

Within easy reach of your cruise, Berlin is just an hour by train from Fürstenberg. From Brandenburg Gate to Museum Island and the Reichstag, it's a city like no other - and well worth the detour. On longer cruises of 10 nights or more, you can even arrive right into the heart of the city on your boat.



Amsterdam

Venice, Italy

Moor in the Venetian Lagoon and take a vaporetto into one of the most beautiful cities in the world. The Piazza San Marco, the Campanile, the Bridge of Sighs - all within reach. Our Venice (Casale) base is a 4-hour cruise away, with the centre just 30 minutes by car.

Bruges, Belgium

Medieval streets, a UNESCO World Heritage centre, and yes, the Fries Museum is exactly what it sounds like. From our Nieuwpoort base it's a 6.5-hour cruise, or 45 minutes by car.

Ottawa and Toronto, Canada

From our Smiths Falls base, Canada's capital Ottawa is around 19 hours by boat - ideal for a longer 10-night break. Cruise the historic Rideau Canal before mooring in the heart of the city to explore Parliament Hill, the ByWard Market and the Canadian Museum of History. If you're short on time, Ottawa is just an hour away by road, while Toronto is around a 1-hour-and-20-minute drive from our Peterborough base on the Trent-Severn Waterway - both great add-ons at the start or end of your trip.

Friuli, Italy

Full-bodied whites - Chardonnay, Pinot Grigio - from the Collio hills, and sparkling Prosecco right on your doorstep in Venice.

Canal du Midi, France

Languedoc produces more variety than almost anywhere else in France. Fruity Corbières reds, sparkling Crémant de Limoux, Muscat de Minervois. Moor up, pick a direction, start tasting.

Burgundy: Franche-Comté, France

Chagny sits at the border of two great wine-growing areas - Côte de Beaune to the north, Burgundy Crémant country all around. For a truly different perspective, take a hot-air balloon over the vineyards.

Burgundy: Nivernais & Loire, France

Sancerre on one bank, Pouilly-Fumé on the other. Taste Chablis near Auxerre. That's not a bad few days.

Aquitaine, France

Bordeaux vineyard country, plus the cellars at Buzet for tours and tastings. And if you want something stronger, Armagnac brandy is made right here - Maison Ryst Dupeyron in Condom is worth the stop.

Canadian Grand Prix (Montréal): Usually late May - 240km from our Smiths Falls base on the Rideau Canal, Canada

July

Tour de France: Throughout July, various locations in France

Wimbledon: Early July, Wimbledon - 32 km from our London (Chertsey) base, River Thames, England

Henley Royal Regatta: Late June/Early July, Henley-on-Thames, River Thames, England

Flowers, gardens and art

Tour de France

Kids' club is located *everywhere!*

Kids take to boating fast. Planning the route, watching the locks in action, spotting wildlife - there's always something to do.

Here are four destinations that work well for families.

Camargue, France

Beach fun, Mediterranean sunshine, wild Camargue horses and pink flamingos in the wetlands. The Canal du Rhône à Sète runs right along the coast, with warm-water beaches and funfair amusements close by.

The River Thames, England

Green spaces, splash parks and picnic spots all the way along. Thorpe Park and Legoland are both reachable for a day out, and London is just a tube ride away.

Brittany, France

Water activity centres for kayaking, sailing and paddleboarding. An open-air pool with pedalos at Guenrouët. And Nantes is one of France's most family-friendly cities - home to a 12-metre robotic elephant you can actually ride.

Canal du Midi, France

The western stretch between Trèbes and Port Cassafières is especially good for families - frequent stops, lively towns, nearby beaches and lakes for swimming. The canal itself has a 173-metre tunnel and the famous nine-gate staircase of locks at Fonseranes. That alone keeps kids talking for days.

Béziers - one of France's oldest cities, with the impressive Saint-Nazaire Cathedral and sweeping views over the Orb Valley.

Narbonne - a vibrant Roman city with Spanish flair, great markets, and a cathedral that's worth a stop.

Mediterranean beaches - near Agde and our Port Cassafières base - the sea is right there.

Families - beaches, lakes, kayaking on the River Aude, the Vélorail near Capestang, and an amusement park in Vias.

What's to love:

Nevers, Auxerre and Sens - three historic cities, each with a stunning cathedral and easy riverside mooring.

Vézelay - a UNESCO hilltop village 16 km from the canal, famed for its basilica and sweeping views.

Sancerre - vineyards, local winemakers, and some of the best white wine in France.

Caves de Bailly - a former limestone quarry where Crémant de Bourgogne is made - cool, atmospheric, and open for tours.

Hilltop villages - Châtel-Censoir, Merry-sur-Yonne and Maily-le-Château all reward the climb with breathtaking views.



Burgundy: Franche-Comté

*Timeless heritage, exquisite flavours,
and scenic waterways*

Eastern France, quiet and beautiful - dense forests, limestone cliffs, stone farmsteads and sleepy villages. The River Seille is a genuine wildlife haven. A mix of automatic, self-operated and manned locks keeps the cruising varied and engaging.

"Stop at Mantoche, just south of Gray, where the harbour master is also a chef with his restaurant right on the little marina. Then cruise north to Soing to see the mini Eiffel Tower. You might think you're in Paris!"

What's to love:

Beaune - colourful tiled roofs, charming shops, local cheeses and gourmet food. A classic Burgundy town.

Prestigious vineyards - Côte de Beaune meets sparkling Crémant country. Domaine de la Folie near Chagny is a standout.

Dijon - elegant architecture, great museums, fine dining - nicknamed 'Mini Paris' for good reason.

Dole - charming port beneath a grand cathedral, cobbled streets, and the birthplace of Louis Pasteur.

Wildlife - otters, roe deer, foxes, kingfishers, bee-eaters and golden orioles along the riverbanks.

The River Lot winds through dramatic limestone cliffs, past medieval villages and vine-lined valleys. With manual locks and stronger currents, this route suits more experienced boaters looking for something more active.

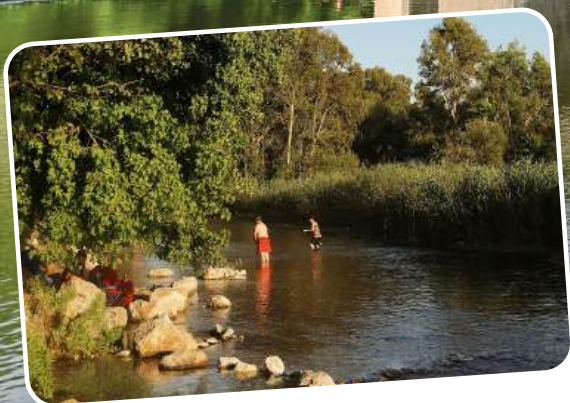
Cosa amerai:

Cahors - a lively medieval town with the iconic Valentré Bridge and world-renowned Malbec wines.

Saint-Cirq-Lapopie - a fairy-tale village perched dramatically on a cliffside with cobbled streets and extraordinary views.

Supporting local communities

When you travel with us, your trip helps sustain the towns and villages along your route. From cafés and markets to family-run restaurants, local businesses benefit directly from your visit, helping to keep communities thriving. We also support initiatives such as tree-planting along the Canal du Midi and developing marine apprenticeships to support local skills and employment.

Environmental Care

We've moved away from conventional cleaning products at more than 60% of our bases. Water filters are fitted on all new boats to cut nasty plastic waste. Plus, we're trialling cleaner fuels where we can.

Cleaner Waterways

We continually work alongside navigation authorities to improve water quality and wastewater infrastructure across our regions. At half our bases, we now use treated canal water to wash our boats – massively cutting down our freshwater usage.

Responsible Boating

When you boat, you're part of a community of like-minded people. Every customer gets practical guidance on travelling considerably – from the right speed they travel to waste and water use.

Three simple ways to make a difference

Choose local.

Eating at independent cafés, visiting village markets and buying local products supports the communities along your route. So it gives you a more authentic experience of the places you pass through.

Be considerate.

It's the little things. Slow down near homes, wildlife and moored boats - it helps protect the waterways and surrounding habitats. And it gives you more time to take it all in - the landscape, the wildlife, and the people you're sharing it with.

Respect nature.

Hold a steady course when you spot wildlife. Moving quietly through these waterways puts you closer to nature than almost any other kind of travel. We also recommend bringing biodegradable, eco-friendly soaps and shower gels and choosing products free from microplastics to help protect aquatic life.





What's included and what costs to plan for

Included in your boat hire price

Your fully equipped boat, with all the essentials and comforts for living and relaxing on board.

A comprehensive pre-departure briefing and demonstration, so you're confident and ready to set off.

Onboard cruising maps and navigation advice, for reassurance and easy route planning.

Help from our friendly, knowledgeable local teams, plus tips on regional highlights and itinerary suggestions.

Other costs to plan for

The following costs are charged separately, some of which only apply to certain routes/destinations.

Damage Deposit

All customers are required to pay a Damage Deposit on arrival at the base. If your boat and/or equipment is returned damaged, you will be charged up to the value of this deposit at the end of your holiday.

You can reduce your upfront deposit and limit your financial responsibility by adding our optional Damage Risk Reduction.

This simple, one-time cost can be added to your booking in advance or paid locally at the base. It's a smart way to enjoy greater protection and peace of mind while on the water.

Fuel

You have the option to purchase Pre-paid Unlimited Fuel* when you book your holiday which makes it easy for you to budget. If you choose not to, then onboard equipment will record how many hours you run your engine for during your cruise and you will be charged an hourly rate when you return your boat, payable at your end base in local currency. This cost covers the fuel you use to power the boat's engine and onboard systems (such as heating), as well as gas and general engine wear and tear. The 'hourly rate' differs by region and boat type, and depends on market fuel rates, and is subject to change. Our Sales Team can give an estimate of our current rate prior to your holiday and the actual rate can be confirmed at check-in.

Fuel Deposit

Before you depart, you must leave a Fuel Deposit in local currency. At the end of your cruise, when your fuel charge is calculated, you will either be refunded the difference or asked to pay any excess hours used. If you have purchased Pre-paid Unlimited Fuel then a Fuel Deposit will not be required.

One-way supplement

(on one-way routes only)

There is an additional supplement for all one-way cruises, payable at the time of booking. It is automatically added, as a cost, to your booking and is included in the prices quoted on our website when applicable.

Moorings

(Scotland, Italy, and Canada only)

In some destinations, a compulsory fee for moorings is automatically added, as a cost, to your booking and is included in the prices quoted on our website when applicable (see pages 80-81 for more details).

*Pre-paid fuel prices vary by boat type and cruising region, and are subject to change in line with market fuel rates.



Good to know

About our holidays

Our cruising season

Our cruising season runs from 1st April to the end of October, except for Ireland (which starts in mid-March for St Patrick's Day), the Canal du Midi (starting late March), and Canada (mid-May to mid-October). For exact dates, check availability on our website.

Duration

Our boating holidays have a minimum stay of 3 nights with the flexibility to stay as long as you wish. 2-night breaks are available on selected weekends in April, May, June and October from Vinkeveen, Marina Wolfsbruch, Castelnau-dary, Port Cassafières, St Gilles, Decize, Benson, London (Chertsey) and Carrick-on-Shannon, running from Friday afternoon to Sunday evening. At all other times and bases, a minimum stay of 3 nights applies.

One-way cruising

We offer more one-way cruising options than any other operator. Simply arrive at your final base on the agreed date and time. Occasionally, for operational reasons, the direction of your route may change at short notice or switch to a return trip. A supplement applies and varies by route.

Car transfers

If you're driving to your start base for a one-way cruise, we can transfer your car to the end base for a fee (cost depends on distance). This must be pre-booked. Car transfers are not available in Germany.

Return cruising

On return routes, you can revisit favourite places or explore new ones on your way back. Be sure to arrive back at the base in time to return your boat as scheduled.

Occupancy

Each boat has a maximum occupancy limit for insurance purposes. A minimum of two adults is required on board (three for Vision boats).

Age requirement

You must be at least 18 years old to captain a boat in most destinations (21 in Canada).



Preparing for your holiday

Travel insurance and cancellation cover

Personal travel insurance is mandatory for all international bookings and should include cover for unexpected events, including medical emergencies. We recommend arranging this as soon as your booking is confirmed.

If you're travelling domestically (or you're an EU resident holidaying within the EU, or a US resident visiting Canada), we also strongly recommend insurance.

Passports and Visas

Ensure your passport and any required visa are valid for your destination. Canada: most non-US travellers require an electronic travel authorisation (ETA). EU: nationals from countries like the UK, US, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand will require an ETIAS. Others, such as South Africa, may need a visa. Visit <https://travel-europe.europa.eu> or consult your local embassy for the latest requirements.

Licences

A boating licence is NOT required for most of our destinations, except for parts of Germany. If cruising in licenced areas (mainly around Berlin in Brandenburg), you must obtain a valid licence before your trip and provide it at the time of booking. If you don't have a licence and will stay in licence-free

areas in Germany, you must still attend a mandatory 2-hour briefing, before you depart, at 2pm. A licence is also needed in our French Alsace region, but only if you wish to cross the border into Germany or Luxembourg. Please speak to our Boating Experts for more details.

What to pack

Use soft bags for easier storage on board. Recommended items include: rubber-soled shoes, gloves for handling ropes, binoculars, torch, all-weather clothing, credit/debit card (Visa/Mastercard) for base deposit, sunscreen, hats, sunglasses, insect repellent, beach towels, 1-ply biodegradable toilet paper (1 roll per onboard toilet provided), eco-friendly soaps and shampoos, eco-friendly dish soap and cleaning products (available to pre-buy or buy at base), food and drink.

Optional extras

To enhance your holiday, we offer a range of optional extras, some of which can be pre-booked to guarantee availability. These include bike hire, early check-in, late check-out, gas barbecues (for boats that don't already have them), stand-up paddle boards, eco-cleaning packs, angling dinghies (Ireland only), and gift baskets of local produce. Not all extras are available at all bases or on all boats, so we recommend checking in advance and booking early to avoid disappointment.

Bringing your pet

A boating adventure is the perfect kind of holiday to share with your four-legged friend. We welcome a maximum of two dogs per boat, and a pet cleaning supplement applies. If you have any questions about taking your dog abroad, our Boating Experts will be happy to advise.

Travel and parking

Maps, GPS coordinates, and base addresses are available on our website. Some bases offer gated and/or garage parking; please book in advance. Our Sales Team can also assist with taxi details and local fare information.

Planning your itinerary

Visit our website for route suggestions and downloadable regional guides. Guides and maps are provided on board. For more detailed maps, visit our website or contact our Sales Team.

Before you travel

You must tell us who will be on board by completing our online Guest Information Form after you have booked. On this form, you'll also need to nominate a captain and a second-in-charge. These individuals will be responsible for the safety of the crew and the proper operation of the boat while cruising. All crew members must watch a short safety video, which we'll send you a link to before your trip. Completing all pre-departure tasks in advance helps ensure a smooth check-in. Our team will call you during the week before departure to confirm your arrival plans and answer any questions.

When you arrive

Arrival time

Standard check-in is between 3pm and 5pm (2pm - 4pm in Scotland). If you've pre-booked an early check-in, you can arrive from 11am. To reduce waiting times, we stagger arrivals and aim to check you in as quickly as possible. Our base team will call you within 7 days of arrival to confirm your check-in time. Please complete the Guest Information Form within 14 days of making your booking, so we have the best contact number for you. Once checked in, your boat may not be ready immediately, but we'll settle you on board as soon as we can and advise when your essential safety briefing will take place. You cannot depart until you've received this briefing. Most customers leave in the early evening or the following morning.

Checking in

Our friendly, multilingual base team will greet you and provide helpful local advice. Any extras you've pre-booked will be waiting for you on board.

Pre-departure briefing and boat-handling demo

Our team will give your nominated captain and second-in-charge a practical demonstration on driving, mooring, and, where possible, using locks. You'll receive full instruction to ensure you're confident before departure.

While cruising

Locks

Locks can seem daunting at first, but you'll quickly get the hang of them – and soon they become an easy and enjoyable part of the experience. Locks vary in type. They may be electric or manual, staffed or self-service. Opening hours differ by region and they may be closed on public holidays. For a lock-free option, consider a return cruise from St. Gilles (Camargue).

Moorings

Public moorings are generally plentiful, although some may charge a fee. Marinas often offer amenities such as electric hook-ups, water, and showers for a fee.

Germany: Mooring on canals is not permitted. Use marinas or anchor in lakes.

Italy: Mooring is limited in Venice.

Private moorings are provided at selected locations in the surrounding area for a compulsory supplement, payable at the time of booking.

Canada: Mooring is allowed only in private marinas, town/village docks, or Parks Canada marinas. A mandatory Parks Canada mooring fee is included in your booking. Additional services such as shore power may incur extra charges.

Scotland: A canal mooring and facilities fee applies and is added to your booking.

Wastewater pump-out

In Canada, England, Scotland, Ireland, the Netherlands, Germany, and an increasing number of regions in France (where waterway infrastructure is gradually being upgraded), wastewater is stored on board and must be pumped out at designated waterside stations, typically every 3 to 4 days, at your own expense. A final pump-out at the Le Boat base is provided free of charge. Pump-outs are not required in the French regions of Burgundy: Nivernais & Loire, Burgundy: Franche-Comté, Alsace, Belgium and Italy.

TV, phones and Wi-Fi

Our Horizon and Liberty boats have smart TVs which require mobile data or Wi-Fi. Signal strength varies; coverage is usually better in towns and villages. Wi-Fi packs are available for purchase (not available in Italy or Canada) and are included on Liberty boats.

Electronics and power

All boats have 12V sockets (car charger style). Some also have 230V (120V in Canada) for which you'll need an adapter. These sockets work only while cruising or when connected to shore power. Use of high-powered devices is limited. Premier boats have USB ports in the lounge/diner area and cabins.

Return time

Boats must be returned and vacated by 9am on your final day (or by midday if you've booked a late check-out). Locks may not open before 9am, so it's best to pass through the final lock the day before. You're welcome to stay aboard at our base the night before departure. If you plan to check out early, notify the base team in advance.

If you book a 2-night weekend break (available on selected weekends from selected bases), you'll need to return and vacate your boat by 5pm on Sunday.
